


Bo Zhao - Tianjin, China

How did you hear about Edmonds Community College?

My family friend helped me enroll at Edmonds Community College before I came here. At the time, I arrived late for Fall 1999 quarter, and Edmonds was the only one that accepted my application. Edmonds provided me with the most flexibility.
